You also inquired as to the Department's most recent vacancy rate. As of August 1, 2022, DSPS had 256.14 authorized positions, of which 30.25 (11.8%) were vacant. Of these vacant positions, 2.25 positions (1.25 PR and 1.0 FED) had been vacant for six months or longer. It should be noted that the agency's vacancy rate currently includes 9.0 vacant FED project positions in the Division of Professional Credential Processing that are authorized from February 28, 2022, through December 31, 2022.
